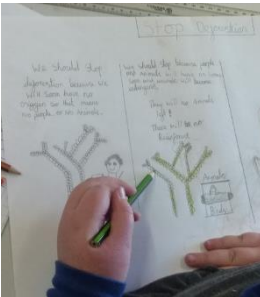
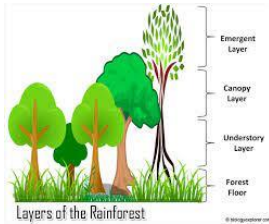


Spotlight on Year 4

This term in Year 4 we are learning all about the tropical rainforests of the world. We have so far learnt that tropical rainforests lie near the equator and are between the Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn. We had great fun using the atlases to discover this! After, we looked more closely at a tropical rainforest and we were surprised to see that there are layers: the forest floor, the under story, the canopy and the emergent. We were also excited to discover just some of the weird and wonderful creatures which live in the rainforest but were disappointed to learn how deforestation can impact these amazing animals and their habitat. We can't wait to find out more!

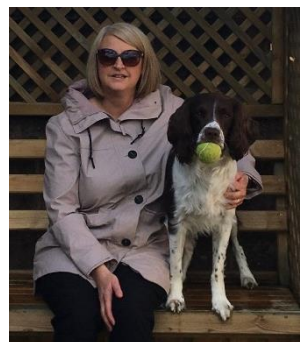
